

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Philleo Nash, the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, during his short tenure of office has exemplified himself as one of the most progressive and outstanding Commissioners of all times, and

WHEREAS, Indian Peoples' standard of living is now being raised due to the Commissioner's dedicated leadership, and

WHEREAS, due to his keen interest in the education and character building of Indian youth, the Paradise Youth Camp is now flourishing, and

WHEREAS, the Dining Hall would not have been built except for the efforts of the Commissioner.

BE IT RESOLVED that, in honor of Philleo Nash, the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, hereafter be named and dedicated as the PHILLEO NASH HALL.

The foregoing resolution was on July 7, 1965 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
