RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Fort Apache Indian Reservation is covered with a very rich and varied composition of vegetation, and
- WHEREAS, the collection, identification and storage of plant material from the reservation documents its existence and nature, and
- WHEREAS, it is advantageous for the White Mountain Apache Tribe to have available (to them) as much information as possible regarding the vegetative resources of the reservation, and
- WHEREAS, the encouragement of collecting plant specimens on the reservation by a competent professional botanist will increase the total knowledge of plants existing on the reservation.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe grants the privilege of collecting plant specimens for inclusion in the Herbarium of the University of Arizona at Tucson on the lands and waters of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, to Dr. C. T. Mason, Curator of the Herbarium, University of Arizona.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Dr. Mason will be requested to provide the Tribal Council with a list of all plants collected and identified by him on the reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on March 2, 1966 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
