RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the State of Arizona, acting by and through its Highway Department has made application for a highway right of way 100 feet in width and 1.02 miles in length, across tribal lands of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, Arizona, and
- WHEREAS, the right of way being requested is for the purpose of improving the Whiteriver to Indian Pine Highway #73 by realigning a portion of the highway and constructing a new bridge over Cottonwood Canyon Wash, and
- WHEREAS, the application by letter dated April 27, 1966 indicated that an appraisal of the land is now in process and upon completion, a Schedule of Damages would be submitted.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that consent is hereby given to the granting of a highway right of way 100 feet in width and 1.02 miles in length, as delineated on map of definite location #D-9-T-225, to the State of Arizona, subject to the following conditions:
 - 1. Payment of compensation to the Tribe for said right of way based on an appraisal to be made by applicant and approved by the Bureau of Indian Affairs.
 - Applicant to be required to construct and maintain all fences and cattleguards where needed along said right of way.

The foregoing resolution was on May 4, 1966 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
