RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, there is currently no system in force on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation to provide for testing of scales, including cattle scales, gasoline pumps or other devices used for dispensing or measurement of products, and
- WHEREAS, the State of Arizona has not previously had legal authority to perform these functions on Indian Reservations, and
- WHEREAS, the recent session of the Arizona State Legislature has now provided the legal machinery for the testing of weights and measures by state personnel at no expense to the Tribes, other than a nominal fee for each measuring device as is charged all merchants (i.e., a small charge will be made to check weighing and measuring devices owned by the Tribe).
- BE IT RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council heartily approves the reestablishment of a Reservation-wide weighing and measuring check system to be performed by State of Arizona officials.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council expresses its appreciation to the State officials responsible for the action which restores this activity to the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on June 2, 1966 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
