RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the community of Cibecue has a grossly inadequate health facility, and
- WHEREAS, there are approximately 869 residents within this community, and
- WHEREAS, Cibecue is some 50 miles from Whiteriver, the nearest hospital, and
- WHEREAS, because of the above, many Indian peoples' health standards are below the average that exists on other parts of the reservation, and
- WHEREAS, there is now a sawmill and logging operation industry at Cibecue, and
- WHEREAS, there will probably be a new mining industry established near Cibecue, and
- WHEREAS, this will mean an increase in the population of the community that will require additional medical facilities.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council hereby requests that the Secretary of the Interior requests the Bureau of the Budget to authorize sufficient funds to construct and maintain an adequate health center at Cibecue, Fort Apache Indian Reservation, Navajo County, Arizona.

The foregoing resolution was on December 8, 1966 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
