RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the present Plan of Operations for the Fort Apache Timber Company requires them to compete for timber offerings off of the Tribal Block, and
- WHEREAS, the production of the Fort Apache Timber Company has exceeded the allowable cut from the Tribal Block, and
- WHEREAS, the new Plan of Operations, which is presently in Washington for approval, provides for the Fort Apache Timber Company, with Tribal Council approval, to have the right of first refusal on other timber offerings on the reservation, and
- WHEREAS, the proposed Paradise Creek Logging Unit which is off of the Tribal Block is needed to meet the cutting requirements of the Fort Apache Timber Company.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Paradise Creek Logging Unit be sold to the Fort Apache Timber Company under the conditions as proposed in the new Plan of Operations.

The foregoing resolution was on June 21, 1967 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
