## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Public Health Service has assumed responsibility for health and sanitation services on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the Public Health Service to inspect all eating establishments on the reservation, and
- WHEREAS, the Sanitarian, Whiteriver Unit, Indian Health Division, U. S.
  Public Health Service now provides regular inspection of all
  eating establishments other than Parochial and Public School kitchens
  and baths on the reservation.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the U. S. Public Health Service is hereby requested to provide periodical inspections of the kitchens, dining rooms and rest rooms of all Parochial and Public Schools on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that reports of these inspections will be made to the Chairman of the Tribal Council and the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Agency.

The foregoing resolution was on September 4, 1968 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
