RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, many of the White Mountain Apache people live in unsanitary and unsafe wickiups and other huts, and
- WHEREAS, many of these people would qualify for Federal Low Rent Housing units, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe, almost four years ago, requested the Federal Housing Administrator to authorize the building of housing on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, the Apaches are still in dire need of these houses.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Chairman, the Superintendent and the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority are hereby requested and directed to make application to the proper governmental agency for the building of twenty (20) low rent houses to be constructed on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, Navajo County, Arizona.

The foregoing resolution was on December 4, 1968 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
