## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Arthur J. Meier has served the White Mountain Apache people for twenty five years as Teacher and Principal of the East Fork Lutheran Mission School, and
- WHEREAS, during this period of time he has had a deep, sincere interest in not only teaching the Apache children but in making them, both morally and spiritually, better citizens, and
- WHEREAS, even though it was detrimental to his health and wellbeing, he has continued to serve as both a Principal and a Teacher, and
- WHEREAS, he is loved by all the Apache people who have had the pleasure of becoming acquainted with him.
- BE IT RESOLVED that Arthur J. Meier is hereby made an Honorary Member of the White Mountain Apache Tribe including, but without stint, free Tribal Hunting and Fishing privileges.

The foregoing resolution was on January 8, 1969 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
