

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, there are four sections of bridge decking available for the use of the Tribe, one at Carson City, Nevada and three at Parker, Arizona, and

WHEREAS, these are needed in the Diamond Creek area, and

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs does not have money to transport these sections to Whiteriver, and

WHEREAS, the Forestry Committee has reviewed this problem and recommends that the cost of shipping these bridge decking sections \$1,300.00 be paid for by the Road Suspense Account.

BE IT RESOLVED that these steel sections be transported to Whiteriver and the cost be paid by the Fort Apache Timber Company Road Suspense Account.

The foregoing resolution was on February 4, 1970 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
