

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs has constructed and paved Route 46 known as East Fork Loop, and

WHEREAS, the hill from Station 5+00 near Whiteriver to Station 17+50 near the Tribal Fairgrounds was widened to accomodate pedestrian traffic, and

WHEREAS, the fill extended over the original right-of-way line and an additional thirty (30) feet is needed.

BE IT RESOLVED that a gratuitous right-of-way as mentioned above is granted to the Bureau of Indian Affairs pursuant to the map of definite location on file in the Superintendent's Office, Whiteriver, Arizona to which reference is hereby made.

The foregoing resolution was on March 4, 1970 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
