RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Law and Order Committee of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has presented a proposed project entitled, Youth/Investigation Section for proposed funding through the Arizona State Justice Planning Agency, and
- WHEREAS, this proposed project is to recruit and train competent, local residents in the field of delinquency prevention, investigation, public relations and proper treatment of juvenile offenders who are placed on probation by Federal and Tribal Courts, and
- WHEREAS, the specific objectives will be to reduce the high rate of offenses by juvenile through prevention programs in all reservation schools and communities and to promote a closer relations between the citizens and the police, and
- WHEREAS, the program will also provide probation and supervision and counselling service for pre delinquent and delinquent children.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Arizona State Justice Planning Agency is hereby requesting to fund the program as presented in the total amount of \$70,385.00.

The foregoing resolution was on March 4, 1970 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
