

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Mr. George Overby, Area Road Engineer has proposed contracting under the Buy-Indian Act of road construction on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation to the Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, Indian contractors are new operations on the Hualapai and San Carlos reservations, and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council desires to secure more employment for members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe on road construction jobs and to train members of the Tribe in the management of constructional jobs.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe and the Bureau of Indian Affairs are encouraged to negotiate contracts under the Buy-Indian Act with an Indian-owned firm now in operation and train at least two members of the Tribe to be selected by the Bureau of Indian Affairs in consultation with the State Employment Service and the Tribal Council.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that these contractors will give preference to local residents and employment under these contracts.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that contracts be negotiated with the trainees with the above-mentioned program as soon as the Bureau of Indian Affairs feels they are capable.

The foregoing resolution was on June 4, 1970 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
