## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Fort Apache Timber Company, purchaser of the Reservation Creek Beetle Control Logging Unit, Contract No. H50C-1420-7065 approved by the Area Director on May 15, 1970 is required to remove spruce sawlogs and pulp as a control measure to reduce the spruce bark beetle infestation, and
- WHEREAS, all green material four inches and larger must be removed, and
- WHEREAS, the logging contractors are unable to do so at the present contracted rate, and
- WHEREAS, it would be in the Tribe's interest to forgo the stumpage rate of \$1.20/cord and allow Fort Apache Timber Company to pay their logging contractors this amount if this will insure that they will carry out their obligations of the timber contract.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Fort Apache Timber Company be charged for stumpage on all sawlogs but the stumpage rate of \$1.20 per cord for pulpwood will not be charged Fort Apache Timber Company in order that they pay this amount to the logging contractors to insure satisfactory performance under the Timber contract.

The foregoing resolution was on June 4, 1970 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
