


RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Branch of Roads has surveyed for a multipurpose, main access road beginning at the East Fork Loop and extending easterly to connection with Indian Service route #8, for a distance of approximately 35 miles, said proposed route designated as Route #55, and

WHEREAS, it will be necessary to obtain a 200 feet wide right-of-way for the entire length of Route #55 before construction can be started.

BE IT RESOLVED that this resolution serves as approval of a 200 feet wide gratuitous right-of-way for the approximate 35 mile length of Route #55 as will be specifically delineated as to location by maps and plats as furnished by the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Branch of Roads.

The foregoing resolution was on July 9, 1970 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against and 1 abstained by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
