RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Forestry Committee recommended to the council that the four Forestry Technicians now supervised by the Forestry Department of the Fort Apache Indian Agency would be more effective and it would be economically feasible to the tribe if these technicians were assigned to the Fort Apache Timber Company and under its supervision, and
- WHEREAS, the council feels that this change of policy would result in a more efficient operation of the Board of Fort Apache Timber Company and the forest.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the four Forestry Technicians now supervised by the Forestry Department are hereby transferred to and under the supervision of the Fort Apache Timber Company.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all funds heretofore allocated or budgeted as and for salaries and expenses of these four men is hereby assigned to Fort Apache Timber Company.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the four men be assigned by Fort Apache Timber Company to Forestry work in the woods in order to secure better utilization of tribal timber resources and to help prevent any waste of these resources in the woods.

The foregoing resolution was on August 5, 1970 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
