RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, there has been indiscriminate destruction of small trees and pole stands in the forest by the use of certain logging and road building equipment, and
- WHEREAS, it is absolutely necessary that these pole stands and young growth be preserved to ensure timber in the future.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Agency and all tribal Department Heads, Logging Contractors and timber purchasers be notified that this destruction shall cease and that the company, person or persons that are responsible for said destruction shall pay the cost of cleaning up and replanting trees that have been destroyed.

The foregoing resolution was on August 5, 1970 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
