

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Arizona Highway Department desires to improve a portion of State Route 73 at Amos Wash by removing the existing timber bridge and constructing a 5-unit concrete box culvert, and


WHEREAS, by virtue of this construction it is necessary that the Arizona Highway Department be granted an additional right-of-way.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Tribal Chairman and Superintendent are hereby authorized and directed to grant the Arizona Highway Department a right-of-way and a drainage easement as delineated on the map of definite location No. D-4-T-337 on file in the office of the Superintendent, Fort Apache Indian Agency, Whiteriver, Arizona

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all damages be waived because of the beneficial result to the Tribe that will ensue by the improvement of Highway 73 and the replacement of the timber bridge.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that upon completion of this project, the Arizona Highway Department initiate action to return the excess 2.1 acres of old right-of-way to the White Mountain Apache Tribe, and if there is any asphalt on the excess acreage it shall be removed and the area reseeded.

The foregoing resolution was on September 30, 1970 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
