

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, Shush-Bezazhe Lake was designated as an artificial lure and fly only fishery on an experimental basis, and


WHEREAS, this designation has been well accepted by the public and fishing pressure continues to increase, and

WHEREAS, quality fishing on Shush-Bezazhe can be maintained at less cost and with fewer fish.

BE IT RESOLVED that Shush-Bezazhe Lake continue to be restricted to fishing with artificial lures and flies only until further recommendations are made by the Recreation Board and the fishery management biologist.

The foregoing resolution was on November 4, 1970 duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (f) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
