RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Arizona Indian Centers, Inc. has presented a plan for an Indian Center to be erected in Phoenix, Arizona, and
- WHEREAS, which facility will provide; an Alcoholic Treatment and Rehabilitation Center, Temporary Housing for Reservation Indians visiting the Indian Center; Ceremonial Plaza and space available for the practice of Indian Cultural and Religious Ceremonies for the use of Indians unable to participate at their home reservations; and centralized locations for services offered to Indians by Federal, State and Municipal Agencies; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council as the representative governing body of the White Mountain Apache Tribe wishes to declare the support of the White Mountain Apache Tribe for these needed facilities.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council recognizes the need and supports the proposal of Arizona Indian Center, Inc. for the establishment of the Ira Hayes Memorial Center to be located on the old hospital site of Phoenix, Arizona at 16th Street and Indian School Road.

The foregoing resolution was on April 7, 1971 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
