## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Deer Springs Fire Salvage Logging Unit is not part of the allowable annual cut, and

WHEREAS, the timber on this area has been severely damaged by wildlife, and

WHEREAS, this timber should be sold as soon as possible to prevent an additional loss of revenue to the Tribe, and

WHEREAS, the existing mills on the reservation cannot manufacture this additional timber.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Deer Springs Fire Salvage Logging Unit, as presented in the Forest Officer's Report and proposed contract covering the recommended sale of timber and subject to minor changes and administrative adjustments by the Approving Officer be advertised for sale at the following minimum rate per thousand board feet, and can be manufactured on or off the reservation:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman and Secretary are authorized to execute the contract and related documents necessary to administer the sale of timber for and on behalf of this council.

The foregoing resolution was on September 3, 1971 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1953, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
