RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe desires to operate the Welfare Program upon the Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe wishes to establish positions to operate the program as Tribal employees, and
- WHEREAS, these positions will be supervised by the Chairman of the Health, Education and Welfare Committee.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the White Mountain Apache Tribe that a Buy Indian Contract be established to facilitate this program funding.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the said Chairman is to seek advice and guidance of Fred Banashley, Sr., Tribal Chairman, Barry DeRose, Tribal Attorney and Tim Dye, Superintendent, Fort Apache Agency in the operation of General Assistance and Tribal Work Experience Program and selection of employees.

The foregoing resolution was on November 10, 1971 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
