RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, there is a critical need in Whiteriver for building space to accommodate the State Unemployment Service, the UCLA Dental Clinic, some Public Health Service Officers, a rapidly expanding Tribal Government and other Federal and local agencies, and
- WHEREAS, many highly desirable programs or agencies do not allow funds for construction but do allow funds for leasing of space, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe does not have funds to provide for a general purpose building to accommodate the various offices and operations, and
- WHEREAS, there are indications that HUD and EDA can fund such a project.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, White Mountain Apache Tribal Council, and the Secretary, White Mountain Apache Tribal Council, are authorized and directed to execute any and all documents or processes necessary to consummate the construction and utilization of a new community center facility at Whiteriver.

The foregoing resolution was on November 10, 1971 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Triba, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Triba, ratified by the Triba June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
