## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs water wells in the Cibecue and Cedar Creek communities are not producing a sufficient amount of water to serve the residents of the communities, and
- WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs has requested they be granted authority to do hydrological studies in these communities in order to obtain an adequate water supply, and
- WHEREAS, there is a definite need for good producing wells in the Cibecue and Cedar Creek Communities.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Bureau of Indian Affairs is hereby authorized to conduct hydrological studies in the Cibecue and Cedar Creek areas and to drill water wells at any feasible site that may be located.

The foregoing resolution was on November 10, 1971 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
