RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Recreation and Enterprise Departments have expressed an interest in and need for expansion of facilities to accommodate increased demand by tourists, and
- WHEREAS, the Master Plan of a Fishery Management Program written for the Tribe by the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife supports and justifies such an expansion, and
- WHEREAS, preliminary studies by interested parties indicate that two or three new fishing lakes with access roads, and improvements of existing facilities should be undertaken at this time.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman is authorized and directed to pursue further study on this subject to include arrangements for financing.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman is also authorized to submit application to whatever agencies would appear to be interested in supporting this expansion.

The foregoing resolution was on December 8, 1971 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
