RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Law and Order Committee has recommended that Beverly Bones be asked to resign from her position as Dispatcher with the White Mountain Apache Police Department due to personal misconduct which is embarrassing to the Police Department and the White Mountain Apache Tribe, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council investigated these charges and found them to be true, and it is felt that for the best interests of the Police Department, Miss Bones should be asked to resign.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Council agrees with the Law and Order Committee that Miss Beverly Bones should be asked to resign from her position as Dispatcher with the White Mountain Apache Police Department.

The foregoing resolution was on December 8, 1971 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
