RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the community of Carrizo has had a severe drought during the past summer and a severe winter at present, and
- WHEREAS, unusal conditions have developed as a result of the drought and the bad weather.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Carrizo Community be declared a disaster area.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribe and the Bureau of Indian Affairs make the necessary improvements to prevent further hardship of the citizens of Carrizo from the lack of roads and bridges.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that high priorities be established in the roads and bridge development and immediate assistance be given to the Carrizo Community.

The foregoing resolution was on January 12, 1972 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
