## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Miss Louise E. Kutz has worked and lived, amongst the Apaches, on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, East Fork Lutheran Mission for thirty years, and
- WHEREAS, during this period she has always had the deep, sincere interest of the White Mountain Apaches at heart, and
- WHEREAS, she has worked, as Matron of the Nursery for the last twenty years, twenty four hours a day and rocked 1200 babies, and
- WHEREAS, she is highly respected by all the people on the reservation and has served the Apaches well and far beyond the call of duty.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that Miss Louise E. Kutz is hereby adopted and accepted to be an Honorary Member of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the privileges attached to this honorary membership be as follows: a lifetime permit to hunt and fish within the tonfines of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation with the same seasonal duration, as well as bag and catch limits, as are granted to regular tribal members.

The foregoing Resolution was on January 12, 1972 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (f) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
