## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Resolution No. 71-149, Fish and Game Regulations for the 1972-73 seasons did not specify rates for and control of mountain lions, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council desires harvest and control of the Mountain lion.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the fees for lion permits be Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) each for non-resident and Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) each for resident.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the lion is to be considered a predatory animal and could be hunted at anytime by members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the stockmen may dispose of the lion whenever their stock is in danger.

The foregoing resolution was on January 12, 1972 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (f) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
