RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Attorney, in the past, has used certain attorneys to assist tribal members in their personal problems, and

WHEREAS, certain attorneys have been used to assist the attorney in litigating specialized matters, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that the Tribal Council and the Bureau of Indian Affairs approve these attorneys representing the tribe and its members.

BE IT RESOLVED that the following list of attorneys may be employed by the Tribal Attorney to represent individual Apaches who are unable to pay the cost of an attorney and to further assist the attorney in litigating complicated or specialized matters to-wit:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that no fees shall be paid these said attorneys in excess of the minimum fee as established by the County Bar Association wherein the respective attorney practices.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that no expenditures for said services shall exceed the amount provided in the annual budget under the term "Miscellaneous Legal Activities".

The foregoing resolution was on February 3, 1972 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (k) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
