RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, a fence boundary is needed for Hon Dah Cafe and Motel, and
- WHEREAS, Hon Dah Cafe and Motel should be fenced into the State Highway right-of-way, and
- WHEREAS, a boundary beginning where the centerline of Highway 73 from Hon Dah to McNary, and Highway 73 from Hon Dah to Whiteriver intersection, south a distance of 2900 feet on centerline, then 90° East and 1800 feet, then 90° north and 3235 feet to point on centerline of McNary-Hon Dah State Highway 73, and
- WHEREAS, if State Highway fences right-of-way from McNary cinder pit through Hon Dah to Cooley Ranch, this could be used as fence line.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribe accept this as a fence boundary for Hon Dah Cafe and Motel.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman of the Tribal Council is hereby authorized to execute all documents necessary to establish said boundary.

The foregoing resolution was on March 1, 1972 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
