## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, there is a need to close portions of the reservation to recreationists due to the problems of patrolling the entire reservation and the high fire danger, and
- WHEREAS, the Forestry and Recreation Committees have reviewed and recommended a two-phase closure, and
- WHEREAS, the Branch of Forestry and Recreation Enterprise have agreed to jointly implement the closure, and
- WHEREAS, Recreation Enterprise has requested tribal council approval for opening designated areas for special hunting and fishing.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the following areas, with the exception of Hon Dah Homesites, Hon Dah Trailer Court, Cooley Lake and Boot Lake, will be closed to hunting and fishing, travel and camping, to-wit:

Commencing at Reservation Boundary and Highway 173 to Fort Apache Junction, then west and south of Maverick Road TR 30 to the east boundary of the reservation.

- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Forestry Committee is authorized to close additional portions of the reservation to camping, travel and recreation after consultation with the Manager of the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise and the Fire Control Officer.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that only duly authorized personnel of the Bureau of Indian Affairs or the Tribe be allowed in these closed areas.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution become effective as of the 19th day of April, 1972.

The foregoing resolution was on April 19, 1972 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 13, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
