RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEDEAS, Dr. Maynard, Chief of the Center for Disease Control in Phoenix reviewed the local project at Whiteriver that had been in operation two and one-half $(2\frac{1}{2})$ years, and
- WHEREAS, adequate research information has been collected by the project, and
- WHEREAS, the research information indicates that addition of Vitamin C to the diet of children would help reduce the amount of illness, and
- WHEREAS, the use of Vitamin C will be strictly a voluntary application depending on each individual.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribe is in agreement with the continuation for the Center for Disease Control Program and the use of Vitamin C to attempt to better the health standard of the White Mountain Apache children.

The foregoing resolution was on June 7, 1972 duly adopted by a vote of 5 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
