RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council referred to the Finance Committee the Reservation Acceleration Program for study and evaluation, and
- WHEREAS, it was the intent of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to enter into the Reservation Acceleration Program, to further the development of the Reservation's resources, and
- WHEREAS, the Finance Committee considered the matter and reported to the Council the recommendations that the Council needs additional studies and request from the Commissioner a six (6) months extension before entering into the program.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Superintendent notify the Area Director and the Commissioner of the Bureau of Indian Affairs that the Tribe does not feel that the Reservation Acceleration Program could be submitted at this time without additional planning and consideration.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribe feels that an additional six (6) months time will be needed for the planning and negotiation before submitting the initial program.

The foregoing resolution was on June 8, 1972 duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
