## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Chairman of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has many duties requiring his time and attention, leaving him little time for Committee work, and
- WHEREAS, the Vice Chairman of the White Mountain Apache Tribe can and should relieve the Chairman of much of this Committee work, leaving the Chairman free to concentrate on his other duties.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Vice Chairman of the White Mountain Apache
  Tribe be appointed as Chairman of the Tribal Advisory Committee.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the duties now assigned to the Public Relations Committee, the Apache Scout Committee, the Indian Development District of Arizona and the Emergency Employment Act Committee be transferred to the Tribal Advisory Committee, as well as the duties of other Committees that may later be transferred to the Tribal Advisory Committee in the interest of economy and expediency
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that hereafter the Tribal Advisory Committee is not to be compensated and to attend meetings called by the Chairman of the Committee without pay.

The foregoing resolution was on July 13, 1972 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
