RESCLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Emergency Employment Act Program is providing ample training funds to hire trainee-secretaries for many departments of the Tribe, and
- WHEREAS, it is of paramount importance to economize in the use of tribal funds, and
- WHEREAS, both the Tribal Secretary and the Vice Chairman have traineesecretaries in their offices and there are ample traineesecretaries in the Tribal Business Office.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the position of Pool Secretary be abolished, effective July 28, 1972 and the work now done by this position be divided among the many trainee-secretaries now employed.

The foregoing resolution was on July 25, 1972 duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 1 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1953, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
