RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, since 1968, the Tribe and the Bureau of Indian Affairs has been in the process of remonumenting and relocating the reservation line, and
- WHEREAS, the remonumentation and relocation was contracted to the Bureau of Land Management, and
- WHEREAS, the Bureau of Land Management completed the survey and all of the notes have been approved on the remonumentation, and
- WHEREAS, the remonumentation clearly shows encroachment upon the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, White Mountain Apache Tribe, and
- WHEREAS, the tribe has marked the said boundary on fifty-foot intervals within the Lakeside Subdivision area.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it does not wish to grant leases, easements or permits for ingress and egress within the Lakeside Subdivision boundary area or other areas of infringement.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the parties involved be notified of the above action and requested to remove any fixtures or property within the area as designated by the Bureau of Indian Affairs.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Superintendent and the Area Office take appropriate action to protect this boundary and remove those in trespass.

The foregoing resolution was on August 28, 1972 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
