RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, James Pettis, for a number of years, has occupied an unfenced area of land along the north boundary of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, it is the wish of the Tribal Council that the area of land, not exceeding two (2) acres, be fenced.
- BE IT RESOLVED that James Pettis is hereby authorized to occupy no more than two (2) acres of ground.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the description of the land be prepared by the Bureau of Indian Affairs and that a copy of the description be filed in the Tribal Council Office.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, within sixty (60) days after the description is prepared, that the said James Pettis fence the area so described.

The foregoing resolution was on September 18, 1972 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 3 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
