## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the tribe has requested that the Bureau of Indian Affairs construct a new road and bridge to the village of Carrizo, and
- WHEREAS, the tribe wishes to grant a gratuitous Right-of-Way from the intersection of Highway 60 through the village for the road and bridge.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it grants to the Bureau of Indian Affairs a gratuitous Right-of-Way as recorded on map on file in the office of the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Agency, Whiteriver, Arizona.

The foregoing resolution was on October 3, 1972 duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 0 against by the council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratifiedby the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
