## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has considered taking over the functions of the Law and Order Program, and

WHEREAS, the Fort Apache Budget has been increased \$50,000.00, and

WHEREAS, the Tribe now desires to contract with the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Fort Apache Agency for the Judicial function and operate their own court.

BE IT RESOLVED by the council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it desires to contract with the Fort Apache Agency, Bureau of Indian Affairs for the complete cost of Judicial Services.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman and the Superintendent submit to the council, as soon as possible, a contract for approval that will permit the Tribe to operate the Judicial Branch of the Law and Order Program under a Buy-Indian Contract.

The foregoing resolution was on October 3, 1972 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
