RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Genuine Apache made Arts and Crafts, as they become more rare, are imitated more and more through cheaply made foreign products, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is interested in encouraging those Apache people who have the skills to be proud of their work in Arts and Crafts and increase their value.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe authorize a system of tags to be designed and made available only to White Mountain Apache Tribal Members for a minimum fee that will state, "This Article has been genuinely handcrafted by a member of the White Mountain Apache Tribe."

The foregoing resolution was on November 1, 1972 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (g) and (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
