## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe and the United States Government required that Southwest Lumber Mills, Inc. furnish a \$5,000.00 bond in connection with a supplemental agreement to a timber cutting contract covering Smith Park-Horse Mesa Unit dated November 1, 1937 and approved January 13, 1938, and
- WHEREAS, Southwest Lumber Mills was to provide certain improvements in the Mexican and Negro sections in the McNary townsite, and
- WHEREAS, Southwest Forest Industries, successors to Southwest Lumber Mills, Inc., executed a business lease with the White Mountain Apache Tribe dated June 28, 1965, and subsequently sold and subleased the McNary townsite to John W. Galbreath and Company, and
- WHEREAS, Southwest Forest Industries has requested that the White Mountain Apache Tribe release the \$5,000.00 bond.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that they have no objection to the release of Southwest Forest Industries Bond No. 17-6933-C, Maryland Casualty Company.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman is hereby authorized to sign any and all documents necessary to effectuate the release of said bond.

The foregoing resolution was on December 6, 1972 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
