RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council had delegated to the Superintendent, authority to negotiate with the First National Bank for the purchase of the old bank building, and
- WHEREAS, the First National Bank felt like they should contribute something to the White Mountain Apache Tribe in the community of Whiteriver, and
- WHEREAS, the total price on the bank building was reduced to \$10,500.00, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council accepted the proposal.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the bank building be purchased for \$10,500.00 with a down payment of \$2,500.00 and the remaining \$8000.00 be financed by the First National Bank.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the \$2,500.00 down payment be made from the current contingency fund.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman be authorized to sign all necessary documents for the purchase and finance of this building.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that upon completion of the purchase that the Superintendent and the Tribal Chairman negotiate with the Employment Security Commission for a rental contract for the use of the building.

The foregoing resolution was on January 22, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
