## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is concerned with the safety program of its employees, and
- WHEREAS, the National Safety Act of 1972, the tribe is required to maintain certain safety standards required by this act, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe desires for its employees safe working conditions.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that a tribal safety committee be established consisting f managers of each enterprise and one representative of the central tribe to develop a safety program to meet the safety requirements of the said National Safety Act.
- E IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this committee select and designate one individual as Chairman, and the committee present a report to the Council at each Regular Council Meeting on the progress and activities of the Tribal Safety Committee.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this committee be delegated the power and authority to enforce the tribal safety requirements to meet the National Safety Act of 1972.

The foregoing resolution was on April 5, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
