## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe desires to update their By-Laws and Constitution, and
- WHEREAS, the last review was adopted on May 29, 1958, and
- WHEREAS, since that date many changes have occurred in the organizational structure of the Tribe and the mode of life of the White Mountain Apache people, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe wishes to improve its Constitution and By-Laws to give the maximum efficiency to tribal operating authorities and the maximum protection and understanding to the White Mountain Apache people, and
- WHEREAS, the Solicitor's Office in Phoenix, Arizona has offered assistance to the tribe and agency in updating the document.
- BF IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Solicitor's Office offer of assistance be accepted for the revision of the White Mountain Apache Constitution and By-Laws.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Raymond Endfield, Jr., Billy Kane, West Anderson and Lafe Altaha, ex-officio, be appointed as a Committee of three to work with the Solicotor's office and Superintendent's office to revise and present to the Council the revised Constitution and By-Laws.

The foregoing resolution was on April 5, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) and (s) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to SSection 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
