RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the business of the Tribal Council is of such importance that all Tribal Council members should be present at each meeting, and

WHEREAS, certain members of the Tribal Courcil often schedule meetings both on and off the reservation that conflicts with the Regular Council meetings, and

WHEREAS, matters of great importance are decided with just a bare quorum of the members being present.

BE IT RESOLVED that hereafter, all Council members shall not schedule any meeting that will conflict with the Regular Tribal Council Meeting unless the scheduled meeting is of a grave importance.

The foregoing resolution was on April 5, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
