RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the road from Highway 73 to the Sunrise Ski Lodge and Ski Run is in a deplorable condition, and
- WHEREAS, the contractor did not complete the construction of said road last year, and
- WHEREAS, it is imperative to the economic survival of the Sunrise Complex that the road be constructed, and
- WHEREAS, Phase II an additional 52 rooms at the Sunrise Motel is not completed, and
- WHEREAS, it is necessary to complete these rooms in order to take advantage of the summer business, and
- WHEREAS, construction of the said rooms could now be resumed at the Sunrise
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Chairman, the Superintendent and Albert McEvoy are to contact the proper State Officials, including the Governor, in order to expedite the completion of the road from Highway 73 to the Sunrise Ski Lodge and Ski Run.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Barry DeRose, the Tribal Attorney, is instructed to have the contractor resume construction of the 52 rooms at the Sunrise Park Motel.

The foregoing resolution was on May 2, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, tatified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
