## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has received surplus equipment, grants and other benefits from the Four Corners Regional Commission, and
- WHEREAS, these benefits have helped alleviate the severe unemployment that exists on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, there is the possibility that the Four Corners Regional Commission may be discontinued July 1, 1973, and
- WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Tribal Council that the federal excess and surplus property program administrated by the Regional Commission be continued.
- BE IT RESOLVED in order to generate support for the continuation of the surplus program through the Four Corners Regional Commission the Council solicit the support of all the Arizona Congressional delegation and the Secretary of Commerce.
- E IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council solicits the support of the Indian Development District of Arizona, the Indian Affairs Commission of Arizona, and all the other Indian tribes in the State shall be contacted to solicit their support in the continuation of this program.

The foregoing resolution was on May 2, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
