## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, that the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Area Office has requested an archaeological investigation and clearance of all Conventional Mutual-Help proposed building sites before construction, and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Alexander J. Lindsay, Jr., Coordinator of Archaeological Research for Northern Arizona Society of Science and Art has approved all of the Mutual-Help building sites except nine of which he recommends further study and other sites located at McNary, and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Bruce Daniels, Production Manager HUD's Indian Team recommends that the tribe further investigate these proposed sites.
- BE IT RESOLVED that Fred Banashley, Sr., Hal Butler, Lafe Altaha are appointed as a committee to investigate all of the sites to be located at McNary, the nine sites recommended for further study by Mr. Lindsay and they are hereby authorized to recommend either approval or disapproval of said sites for archaeological reasons.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the committee is hereby authorized to either approve or deny clearance for all of the proposed building sites after they have made an archaeological investigation of said proposed sites.

The foregoing resolution was on August 1, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.
