## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, it has been determined that one of the problems common to all three f the ureau of Indian Affairs operated post-secondary schools involves current inadequate disbursement procedures for Employment Assistance 1780 and 1787 funds to students qualified for such services, and
- WHEREAS, that such inadequacies in fact cause undue hardship on students and their families because of payments not being received on a regularly scheduled basis, and
- WHEREAS, obligations incurred by students receiving such services must be met in many cases by individuals borrowing from various sources requiring unnecessary interest expense, and
- WHEREAS, the governing boards of the Southwestern Indian Polytechnic Institute, Institute of American Indian Arts and Haskell Indian Junior College have reviewed together the proposal submitted by the Southwestern Indian Polytechnic Institute to the Branch of Education, Central Office Bureau of Indian Affairs, Washington, D. C.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the three aforementioned groverning boards hereby officially signify their support of the Southwestern Indian Polytechnic Institute proposal and requests the implementation of the procedures prescribed therein throughout the Bureau of Indian Affairs activities providing support to these three educational institutions.

The foregoing resolution was on August 2, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
